I Can-Sports Without Limits

SOAR hosted the inaugural "I Can" Olympics in Tsaghgadzor, Armenia, between May 24, and May 27, 2018. "I Can," a national sports festival for children and young adults with special needs, was the first of its kind in Armenia. Shavarsh Karapetyan, champion Armenian finswimmer, who is best known for saving the lives of 20 people in a 1976 incident in Yerevan, served as Master of Ceremonies.



When SOAR conceived "I Can" two years ago, we wanted to

bring together children and adults with disabilities to show them, and others, what special talents they had. The mission of "I Can" is to provide athletic training and competition for children and adults with disabilities, giving them opportunities to develop physical fitness, demonstrate courage, and experience joy. Our goal is to allow these competitors to participate as productive and respected members of society by giving them an opportunity to develop and demonstrate their skills and talents and by increasing Armenia's awareness of their capabilities. Our vision is not only to create an athletic forum within which these competitors can flourish, but to show that inclusiveness with special needs populations is an attainable goal in Armenia.

Approximately 150 special needs children and adults from Yerevan, Gyumri, Kapan, Artashat, Spitak, and Nor Kharberd participated. Sports included basketball, boccia, canoeing, relay races, soccer, and table tennis. Our hope is to host "I Can" every two years.

Monitor quality control performance of staff in Armenia.

Conduct trainings on quality control procedures with staff in Armenia. Ensure that all legal and internal standards established by SOAR's Executive Board are met.

This is an important step for SOAR, as we can now advertise that we have one person who oversees all of the distributions we make in Armenia.
